DRESS CODE

Please adhere to the following:

- No article of clothing may be worn which implies or otherwise promotes alcohol, sex, tobacco, drugs, violence, gangs, racist or offensive language. This includes belt buckles and jewelry.
- No holes in bottom wear. No yoga pants or leggings as pants.
- Any item bearing the logo of any school other than Cleveland Middle and/or Cleveland High School(s) is strictly forbidden. College, military or professional sports team logos are acceptable.
- Solids and patterns are permitted.

DRESS CODE

(pages 4-5)



- **Shirts must cover midriff area, and have a modest neckline. Any style or pattern is acceptable as long as it is modest and appropriate.**
- **Unacceptable shirts include, but are not limited to: see-through, low necklines or spaghetti straps.**
- **Shoes must be worn at all times. House shoes or slippers are not allowed.**
- **Headwear is not to be worn by any student while in the school building.**
- **This includes hats, ball caps, wool hats, beanies, bandanas, do-rags and skull caps.**

DEVICES



- Can be used in hallways and during lunch.
- Can be used in classroom with teacher permission ONLY.
- Outside of those times, devices may not audible or visible.
- If a cell phone is heard or operated in class without permission, the student will be asked to put the phone away. Refusing to follow the directive of an adult will be a Level I Offense.
- Continued unapproved use of devices may result in a court citation.

EXCUSING AN

ABSENCE/TARDY



(page 9)

Tennessee law recognizes five reasons to excuse an absence or tardy:

- 1. Personal illness**
- 2. Illness of an immediate family member**
- 3. Death in the family**
- 4. Religious observances regularly observed by persons of a certain faith**
- 5. Circumstance which, in the judgment of the principal, create emergencies over which the student has no control.**

TARDIES

(page 10)



- **Students are marked tardy if they arrive in the first half of the block without a red pass from a teacher or administrator.**
- **Students are considered absent if they arrive 45 minutes after the beginning of the class.**
- **5 tardies = 1 absence**
- **Excessive tardies can be referred to Campus Court.**
- **Students must attend 210 minutes of the school day to participate in extracurricular events that day.**

HALL PASSES



(page 6)

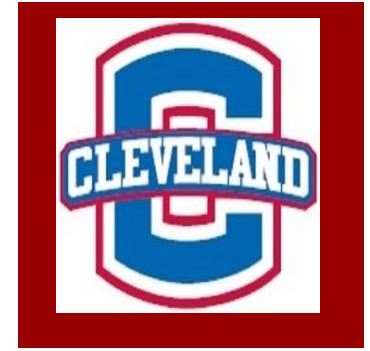
- For your safety, students **MUST** have a red pass if they are in the hallway after the bell.
- 9th and 10th grade must stay in the Commons for lunch at all times. 11th and 12th grade may eat in the Commons, the Courtyard or a teacher's classroom with a red pass. The Commons restroom is the only one that should be used during lunch.
- Because of federal guidelines, vending machines can not be used during 3rd block.

- Free Lunch (CEP) is *no* longer an option.
- Free & Reduced Lunch applications are located on the school nutrition website:

- Completing the application for Free & Reduced Breakfast/Lunch is extremely important.
- Students who qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch will be given a short grace period at the beginning of the year and must reapply each year.

- No early or late requests for date changes will be honored unless prior approval from the principal.
