Dear Parents and Guardians:

We are pleased to announce that Cleveland City Schools will be offering meals at no charge to all students for the 2019-2020 school year. This is a change from last year. We were able to requalify for the Community Eligibility Program (CEP) for all schools.

What does CEP mean for your student(s)? In a CEP program all students receive a nutritious breakfast and lunch at no cost regardless of family income. As long as your student(s) school is on the CEP program there will be no need to fill out a Free & Reduced Lunch Application.

So, rest easy and know that your student(s) will receive nutritious meals when they are at school.

Parents and guardians can also put money in your students meal account several ways for a la carte purchases. You can create an account at www.schoolcafe.com, if you do not already have one, you can apply money to their account in PowerSchool, or you can send a check to school with your student

You may also elect to use PowerSchool and eFunds as your online payment method. You will need to use your PowerSchool Parent account. If you need help with that you can contact your school.
